

The original and each copy of an application for a passport must have attached to it a copy of the applicant's photograph. A loose signed photograph of the applicant must accompany the application. The photographs must be on thin paper, should have a light background and be not over three inches in size.

Fee for passport, one dollar.
Fee for executing application, one dollar.

A woman's application must state whether she is married or not, and a married woman must prove that her husband is a native citizen.

Paragraph 6 of the "Rules governing the granting and
issuing of passports in the United States," promulgated by
the President on January 24, 1917, reads:

Native Citizen.-An application containing the informa-
tion indicated by rule 5 will be sufficient evidence in the
case of a native citizen; except that a person born in the
United States in a place where births are recorded will be
required to submit a birth certificate with his application.
If a birth certificate is not obtainable, the application must
be supported by an affidavit of the physician who attended the
birth or affidavits of parents or other reputable persons
having actual knowledge of the applicant's birth in this
country.
