

DEATH LIST OF A DAY.

John Dunphy.

John Dunphy, sixty-one years old, one of the oldest leather dealers in the Swamp, died Friday at his residence, 903 West End Avenue, after a two-days' illness. Mr. Dunphy was born in Ireland and came to this city to seek his fortune when only sixteen years of age. He first embarked in the comb business and then began to buy and sell hides. This proved a profitable venture and he finally established a large business, with an extensive plant at Marathon, N. J. The firm was known as John Dunphy & Sons, with offices at 99 Gold Street. He leaves a widow, two sons, three daughters, all single, and a sister, who is Mother Superior of the Convent of the Holy Angels at Fort Lee, N. J. Funeral services will be held this morning at 11 o'clock in the Church of the Ascension, One Hundred and Seventh Street and Broadway.
